 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that certain revenue collected by Prince 6 George's County as a result of violations recorded by speed monitoring systems on 7 Maryland Route 210 (Indian Head Highway) be deposited into the Criminal Injuries 8 Compensation Fund and instead requiring that the revenue be credited to the State 9 Highway Administration to be used solely for certain safety-related purposes related 10 to Maryland Route 210 in Prince George's County; repealing as a funding source for 11 the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund revenue generated as a result of violations 12recorded by speed monitoring systems on Maryland Route 210 in Prince George's 13 County; and generally relating to the use of revenue generated as a result of 14violations recorded by speed monitoring systems on Maryland Route 210 in Prince 15George's County.
