3 4	WHEREAS, Obesity leads to at least 300,000 deaths among adults in the United States each year due in part to physical inactivity and a poor diet; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, Inadequate participation in physical activity is a significant contributor to the "epidemic of obesity" that has plagued the nation's young people during the past 2 decades; and
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, Physical activity offers young people many health benefits, including improving aerobic endurance and muscular strength, helping to control weight, building lean muscle and reducing fat, and helping to build greater bone mass, all of which thwart the development of osteoporosis in adulthood and prevent or reduce high blood pressure; and
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, A growing body of evidence suggests that providing students with more physical education and physical activity opportunities helps reduce the cost schools incur by reducing absenteeism, improving student health, and reducing staff time spent addressing academic performance; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, A growing body of evidence also suggests that improvement in test scores and overall academic achievement can be linked to increased time in physical education; and

- 11 (3) EACH PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN PRINCE GEORGE'S

- 17 (C) (1) A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL THAT DOES NOT MEET THE 18 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION SHALL NOTIFY THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY 19 BOARD OF EDUCATION ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2021.
- 20 (2) A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL MAY APPLY TO THE PRINCE
 21 GEORGE'S COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME FOR THE
 22 PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO ESTABLISH A PLAN TO ENSURE FULL COMPLIANCE
 23 WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION BY JULY 1, 2024.
- 24 (3) IF GRANTED, AN EXTENSION SHALL TERMINATE AT THE END OF 25 JULY 1, 2024.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
