A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prince George’s County – Alcoholic Beverages – License Sanctions and Sunday**  
3 **Off-Sale Permits**

4 **PG 317–20**

5 FOR the purpose of altering the alcoholic beverages licenses for which the Board of License  
6 Commissioners for Prince George’s County may issue a Sunday off–sale permit;  
7 authorizing the Board to issue a Sunday off–sale permit to the holder of any Class A  
8 alcoholic beverages license; authorizing the Board to issue a Sunday off–sale permit  
9 to the holder of any Class B alcoholic beverages license with an off–sale privilege;  
10 providing that the holder of a Class B alcoholic beverages license with a Sunday  
11 off–sale permit need not comply with certain requirements; applying certain annual  
12 fees to a Sunday off–sale permit issued to certain license holders; prohibiting the  
13 Board from approving a license renewal for certain persons until a certain period has  
14 elapsed after the date of a certain felony conviction; requiring the Board to revoke a  
15 license if the license holder or a certain stockholder that uses the license is convicted  
16 of a certain felony; providing that a license holder or an employee of a license holder  
17 who violates a certain provision on underage service is guilty of a misdemeanor and  
18 on conviction is subject to imprisonment or a fine or both; and generally relating to  
19 alcoholic beverages and permits in Prince George’s County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

19 4–109.

20 (a) A license application shall state:

21 (9) that the applicant has never been convicted of a felony;

22 (10) whether the applicant has ever been found guilty of violating a law in  
23 the State governing the sale of alcoholic beverages or the prevention of gambling;

24 (12) that the applicant has not had a license for the sale of alcoholic  
25 beverages revoked;

26 (14) whether the applicant has been found guilty of violating a State or  
27 federal law;

1 4-407.

2 (a) A local licensing board:

3 (1) may not renew a license if the board determines that the license holder  
4 is not qualified to obtain a license renewal; but

5 (2) shall issue to the license holder by way of renewal the class or type of  
6 license for which the board determines the license holder is qualified.

7 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a local licensing board shall  
8 deny a license renewal application if during the license year the license holder was  
9 convicted of a State or federal offense that, in the judgment of the board, renders the license  
10 holder unfit or unqualified to obtain a renewed license.

11 (2) A local licensing board:

12 (i) shall hold a public hearing before renewing a license under the  
13 circumstances described in paragraph (1) of this subsection; and

14 (ii) may inquire into all relevant facts and circumstances concerning  
15 the offense at the hearing.

16 6-304.

17 A license holder or an employee of the license holder may not sell or provide alcoholic  
18 beverages to an individual under the age of 21 years.

19 6-402.

20 (a) If a person violates this article and no penalty other than the suspension or  
21 revocation of a license or permit is provided, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor and on  
22 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding \$1,000  
23 or both.

24 (b) If a court has imposed a penalty on an individual license holder who has  
25 obtained a license for or on behalf of a corporation, a partnership, or an unincorporated  
26 association:

1 (1) if the penalty is a fine, the corporation, partnership, or unincorporated  
2 association also shall be liable for the payment of the fine; and

3 (2) if the penalty is imprisonment, the individual license holder shall be  
4 liable to serve the term of imprisonment.

6 This title applies only in Prince George's County.

7 26-1104.

8 (a) There is a Sunday off-sale permit.

9 (b) (1) (i) Subject to subsection (f) of this section and subparagraphs (ii)  
10 and (iii) of this paragraph and except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the  
11 Board may issue the permit to the holder of:

12 1. [a] ANY Class A [beer, wine, and liquor] license; or

13 2. [a] ANY Class B [beer, wine, and liquor] license with an  
14 off-sale privilege.

15 (ii) Five Sunday off-sale permits may be issued only to holders of a  
16 Class B beer, wine, and liquor license with an off-sale privilege that acquired the license  
17 on or after January 1, 2016.

18 (iii) Sunday off-sale permits may be issued to holders of a Class A  
19 beer, wine, and liquor license that acquired the license on or after January 1, 2016.

20 (2) The Board may not issue a Sunday off-sale permit to a license holder  
21 that the Board finds to have sold liquor on Sunday without a Sunday off-sale permit.

22 (c) The permit authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises  
23 consumption on Sunday from 8 a.m. to midnight.

24 (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an applicant for

1 the permit shall commit in the application to reinvesting a minimum of \$50,000 in the  
2 business within 1 year after the permit is issued.

3 (2) (i) The Board may waive the reinvestment requirement.

4 (ii) The Board shall waive the reinvestment requirement for a holder  
5 of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license with an off-sale privilege that acquired the  
6 license on or after January 1, 2016, if the holder can show that a minimum of \$50,000 was  
7 reinvested in the business within the 3-year period immediately preceding the submission  
8 of the application.

9 (3) The Board shall revoke the permit if:

10 (i) the Board did not waive the reinvestment requirement under  
11 paragraph (2) of this subsection; and

12 (ii) the permit holder fails to make the required reinvestment.

13 (e) If the permit is issued to the holder of a Class B [beer, wine, and liquor] license  
14 with an off-sale privilege, the holder need not comply with any restaurant or food  
15 requirement.

16 (f) Not more than 105 Sunday off-sale permits may be in effect at any one time.

17 (g) (1) The application fee for the permit is \$750.

18 (2) The annual fees for the permit are:

19 (i) \$2,590 for the holder of a Class A [beer, wine, and liquor] license;  
20 and

21 (ii) \$1,080 for the holder of a Class B [beer, wine, and liquor] license  
22 with an off-sale privilege.

23 (3) The fees listed in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection are in  
24 addition to the annual fee for the Class A [beer, wine, and liquor] license or Class B [beer,  
25 wine, and liquor] license to which it is attached.

2 In addition to the statement required under § 4–109(a)(9) of this article, an applicant  
3 for a license shall include a signed statement that if the application is made on behalf of a  
4 corporation, that neither the applicant nor any of the stockholders of the corporation have  
5 been convicted of a felony.

6 26–1801.

7 (c) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 4 (“Renewal of Local Licenses”) of  
8 Division I of this article apply in the county:

9 (1) § 4–405 (“Contents of renewal application”), subject to § 26–1804 of this  
10 subtitle;

11 (2) § 4–406 (“Protests”), subject to § 26–1803 of this subtitle; and

12 (3) § 4–407 (“Denial of renewal application”), subject to § 26–1806 of this  
13 subtitle.

14 26–1806.

15 (a) **[The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE**  
16 Board may approve or deny a license renewal if the license holder or a stockholder of the  
17 corporation that uses the license has been convicted of a felony.

18 (b) The Board:

19 (1) shall hold a public hearing before approving or denying the license  
20 renewal; and

21 (2) may inquire into all relevant facts and circumstances concerning the  
22 felony offense at the hearing.

23 **(C) IN THE CASE OF A CONVICTION FOR A FELONY THAT IS RELATED TO**  
24 **OPERATIONS UNDER THE LICENSE, THE BOARD MAY NOT APPROVE A LICENSE**  
25 **RENEWAL FOR A LICENSE HOLDER OR STOCKHOLDER OF A CORPORATION THAT**  
26 **USES THE LICENSE UNTIL AT LEAST 10 YEARS HAVE ELAPSED AFTER THE DATE OF**

1 **THE FELONY CONVICTION.**

2 26–2102.

3 (a) In this section, “conviction” includes:

4 (1) a verdict or plea of guilty;

5 (2) the forfeiture of a bond or collateral accepted on a pending charge,  
6 warrant, or indictment before a court; or

7 (3) the revocation or suspension of a license by the Board because of a  
8 violation of this article or regulations adopted under this article.

9 (b) (1) **THE BOARD SHALL REVOKE A LICENSE IF A LICENSE HOLDER OR**  
10 **A STOCKHOLDER OF A CORPORATION THAT USES THE LICENSE IS CONVICTED OF A**  
11 **FELONY THAT IS RELATED TO OPERATIONS UNDER THE LICENSE.**

12 (2) The Board may revoke a license if:

13 (i) within 2 years a license holder is convicted twice for a violation  
14 concerning an illegal sale of alcoholic beverages in or on the licensed premises on Sunday;  
15 or

16 (ii) within 2 years there are two convictions of the same agent or  
17 employee of a license holder for a violation concerning illegal sales of alcoholic beverages in  
18 or on the licensed premises on Sunday.

19 [(2)] (3) The Board may revoke a license for:

20 (i) a felony conviction of a license holder or a stockholder of a  
21 corporation having the use of a license; or

22 (ii) failure to comply with § 26–1613(c) of this title.

23 [(3)] (4) The Board may:

24 (i) allow a closing of the licensed premises for a reasonable period of

1 time; but

2 (ii) revoke the license for the closing of the licensed premises for  
3 more than 30 days without the approval of the Board.

4 (c) The Board may suspend a license for at least 30 days for:

5 (1) a conviction of the license holder for a violation concerning an illegal  
6 sale of alcoholic beverages in or on the licensed premises on Sunday; or

7 (2) two or more convictions of different agents or employees of a license  
8 holder for a violation concerning an illegal sale of alcoholic beverages in or on the licensed  
9 premises on Sunday.

10 (d) (1) If a license holder has not complied with the residency requirements  
11 specified in § 4–103, § 4–104, or § 4–105 of this article or Subtitle 14 of this title, the Board  
12 may revoke or suspend the license.

13 (2) The Board may revoke or suspend a license:

14 (i) for a conviction of the license holder for a violation of any State  
15 law concerning gambling in or on the licensed premises; or

16 (ii) if, within 2 years, there are two convictions of one or more of the  
17 agents or employees of a license holder for violations concerning gambling in or on the  
18 licensed premises.

19 (3) The Board may revoke or suspend a license that has been issued or  
20 transferred if the license has not been placed in operation after 6 months following the  
21 issuance or transfer.

22 (e) The Board may revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a license, or refuse to issue  
23 a license to an applicant, if the license holder or applicant willfully failed or refused to pay  
24 hotel/motel taxes due to the county within 60 days after the license holder or applicant  
25 received the first notice of delinquency.

26 (f) Two or more violations against the same license holder, agent, or employee or  
27 affecting the same premises occurring on the same day are considered one offense.

2 Section 6–402 (“General penalty”) of Division I of this article applies in the county,  
3 **SUBJECT TO § 26–2801.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

4 **26–2801.1.**

5 **IN ADDITION TO ANY ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY THAT MAY APPLY, A LICENSE**  
6 **HOLDER OR AN EMPLOYEE OF A LICENSE HOLDER WHO VIOLATES § 6–304 OF THIS**  
7 **ARTICLE OR § 10–117 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE IS GUILTY OF A**  
8 **MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT**  
9 **EXCEEDING 4 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,000 OR BOTH.**

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
11 1, 2021.
