5	This title applies only in Prince George's County.

7 8	(a) There is a Class C (fraternal/sororal/service organization) beer, wine, and liquor license.		
9	(b) The Board may issue the license for use by:		
10 11	(1) a local unit of a lodge or chapter of a nonprofit and nationwide fraternal, sororal, or service organization that:		
12	[(1)] (I) is composed solely of inducted members;

15 16	[(3)] (III) has at least 100 members paying dues of at least \$5 per year per member; and

$\frac{22}{23}$	(c) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor by the glass or by the bottle for on-premises consumption by a member or guest		

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accompanied by a member.

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1 (2) The license holder may allow a person that has leased a private room 2 or other area of the licensed premises for a private social gathering to bring beer, wine, and 3 liquor onto the licensed premises for on-premises consumption.

4 (d) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days 5 as set out for a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license under § 26–2004 of this title, except 6 that restrictions on the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday do not apply.

7 (e) The annual license fee is \$910.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 9 1, 2024.
